The results for Manurewa High School make very good reading. They show:

- a continual improvement every year for the last 4 years
- Manurewa High School now achieving at national average at level 1 and 2

This is a result of the hard work by the school, from students, staff and parents.

Term 3 is the crucial term in achieving the results for this year. The foci for this year are improving:

- the writing skills of students through the Write That Essay resource
- achieving in externals by solid exam preparation including practice and homework

The role of parents is crucial in these areas. Senior reports are being issued in Week 3 of Term 3 this year; we realise students and staff need time to make adjustments and improvements. Also being held this term are the **STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT CONFERENCES** on **Wednesday 23 September** for all parents, Practice examinations commence for students Week 8.

Remember also that every student has been issued a student planner for this term. This should be used to plan and record home work and upcoming important dates.

Please support your child during this important term. I am convinced that a crucial factor in our improved results has been the increasing support and guidance from parents.

While there has been improvement in all departments; one department which has led the way is the mathematics department lead by Mr Tony Carey. Mr Carey's contribution to mathematics education in a range of schools and especially at Manurewa High School for the last five years has been recognised by gaining the Jim Campbell Award. There are only 4 or 5 awarded every second year; so it is

significant for Mr Carey to gain such prestigious recognition for his leadership in Maths. Congratulations to Mr Carey.

Jim Campbell Mathematics Teacher Awards

These awards are to recognise personal excellence in Primary or Secondary classroom teaching and support given to others in enhancing their classroom teaching. Nominations are called for these awards which recognise excellence in mathematics teaching. They are presented biennially at the NZAMT Conference in September/October.

NZQA FEES must be paid before 1 September 2015

Students must pay their fees to have the results recorded on their Record of Achievement and to receive certificates.

There are separate *fee structures* for domestic students and international students. *Financial assistance* is available for domestic students to help with the payment of fees.

Basic Fees for 2015 (incl GST):

- Domestic student entry for all NCEA standards and 3 scholarship subjects—\$76.70.
- International student entry to NCEA standards— \$383.30.

The school has no control over fees, we only collect them for NZQA. If you miss this date you will have to pay a late fee of \$50 on top of the standard fee—please do not delay.

If you have a Community Services Card bring it when making the payment to the school Business Centre—this automatically qualifies for a discounted rate.

EXPECT A TRAIN

KiwiRail and TrackSAFE are asking whanau and caregivers to talk to their children about staying safe around the railway.

Children need to know:

- the new electric trains in Auckland are faster and quieter
- trains can come from both directions at any time, and in quick succession
- to stay alert, remove headphones, look both ways for trains and always wait for the bells and lights to stop before crossing the tracks
- the only safe and legal place to cross tracks is at a designated level crossing
- Check out <u>tracksafe.co.nz</u> for practical tips on how to stay safe around the railway there's even a free downloadable simulator – experience being a train driver!

Organisations supporting Rail Safety Week include KiwiRail, TrackSAFE, Auckland Transport, Transdev Auckland, NZ Transport Agency and the New Zealand Police.
