BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT MATRIX

MINOR BEHAVIOUR

- low level

This is low-level behaviour that can be managed in the classroom. Examples include:

- Inattention
- Low level non-compliance
- Off task
- Disruptive
- Not following instructions
- Innappropriate language
- Unprepared for class gear/equipment/work
- · Unauthorised digital use
- Late to class
- Inappropriate uniform
- Health and Safety violations

MODERATE BEHAVIOUR

- mid level

then requires learning area/pastoral support.

- Examples include:
- Repeated level one behaviours after strategies tried
- Verbal Abuse, swearing, intimidation*
- Aggressive behaviour pushing, wrestling, fighting games*
- Vandalism of others or school property*
- Stealing
- Continual defiance
- Cheating/forgery

*Depending on severity this may move to Major level

STRATEGIES

- Teach desired behaviours PB4L learning area matrix
- Focussing activity countdown, keyword, action, do now
- Positive Reinforcement praise behaviour, value cards, kamar
- Minimise disruptive opportunities be on time, be concise, be prepared, have a backup

BEHAVIOURS CONTINUE:

- Restorative Conversation (refer to card):
 - Tell the story
 - Explore the harm
 - Repair the harm
 - Reach an agreement
 - Plan follow up (document on kamar and notify)
- Disruptions time out, loss of privileges, seating plans
- Lateness discussion, kept in, accumulated time
- Inappropriate items request, warning, action or referral
- · Digital device infringements followed up by E-learning Co.

CONSEQUENCES

In the classroom/moment:

- Continue with low-level strategies
- Remove student to another classroom
- Restorative Conversation

Afterwards:

- Record on Kamar including:
 - Incident
 - Consequence
 - Outcome
 - Ensure the Kaitiaki, HoLA and Whanau team are notified

Outcomes may include:

- Involvement of Kaitiaki follow up, shadowing, home contact
- Restorative Converstation with HoLA/Ass.HoLA/Whanau Team
- Placed on Learning Area Contract
- Referral to Student Services or RTLB
- Home may be contacted

MAJOR BEHAVIOUR

- high level

This is mid-level behaviour that is initially managed in the classroom. This is high-level behaviour that requires learning area/pastoral or SLT support.

Examples include:

- Repeated level two behaviours after consequences completed
- Wilful destruction of property
- Threats of violence or violence towards staff
- Agressive swearing at staff
- Fighting, violence or inciting violence
- Physical intimidation or harassment of another student
- Bullying including cyber
- Sexual harassment
- Drug or alcohol use



CONSEQUENCES

Instant referral to HoLA/Whanau Team/SLT

- Student removed from class
- Email those concerned
- Record on Kamar including:
 - Incident
 - Consequence
 - Outcome
 - Ensure the Kaitiaki, HoLA and Whanau team are notified

Outcome:

At the discretion of those concerned Documented on Kamar
