



Kia Ora Students & Whaanau

As you will already be aware the government announced this afternoon that there are further community COVID-19 cases in Aotearoa, New Zealand, meaning all of Aotearoa, New Zealand will remain in Alert Level 4 up until at least midnight on Tuesday 24th August with a further update on Monday 23rd August. **Therefore, school will remain closed for all students.**

For all students with devices work will continue to be up on Schoology from 10am every morning and if your teacher is doing a live lesson it will only be during your timetabled akoranga block. Students who do not have access to a device and/or the internet make sure your Kaitiaki is aware and further learning tasks will be posted on our school Facebook page and emailed on Monday. Remember if you have a smart phone you can download the Schoology App and access your learning from there.

All students will be contacted by their Kaitiaki during the coming days and we will be in touch with further information as it becomes clear what is happening moving forward. Please keep checking our school Facebook & Instagram pages, website, Schoology and your school email for the latest information.

Akoranga Conferences will go ahead next week (Thursday & Friday) as planned but will be **online or by phone** as we do not know yet if we will be out of lockdown and it is really important you select your 2022 options and term 4 Waananga.
