General Information

Level 1 Courses

All students study **English, Mathematics** and **Science**. A choice of three further courses must be made now. Select two courses as your preferred choices and one course as your back up.

All Level 1 courses offer Achievement Standards, Unit Standards, or a mixture of both. The credits from these assessments can be totaled and go towards the National Certificate of Educational Achievement.

To study a language at Level 1 you need to have studied it in Year 10 or discuss with HOLA.

National Certificate of Educational Achievement – Level 1
Students need to gain 80 credits at any level, including 10 credits in both numeracy and literacy.
