Dear Parents / Guardians

There has been a positive and a not so positive start to Term 3.

The positive has been the opening of the refurbished A to D Block. We are calling it the Akoranga Block or A block for short.

The students have been very enthusiastic about working in the new classrooms that give a bright and attractive learning environment for staff and students.

I am very grateful for the amount of work that has been done by many people to make this possible including staff member Julie Lockie who has worked tirelessly from the start of the project through to completion.

It was a great privilege for the school to have a past student Sir John Walker attending the official opening and unveil the plaque on Friday 27 July 2012.

Sir John is one of New Zealand's greatest athletes. To win an Olympic gold and create the world mile record being the first runner to complete a mile in less than 3 min 50 seconds is an incredible feat. What is also special about Sir John is that he has continued to work hard for our community through his work in Find Your Field of Dreams and the Auckland Council.

On a not so positive note, it was very disappointing that over 400 students did not attend the first day of Term 3. High attendance, including the first day of the term and on unpleasant days, means achievement and ultimate success in the job market and in society.

Statistics from last year showed that in Year 11, that 86% of the students who attended over 90% of the classes achieved 80 or more credits. Only 26% of the students who attended less than 90% achieved 80 or more credits.

NZQA Fees

NZQA fees must be paid to the school Business Centre before 1 September 2012.

Students must pay their fees to have their results recorded on their Record of Achievement, and to receive certificates.

There are separate <u>fee structures</u> for domestic students and international students. <u>Financial assistance</u> is available for domestic students to help with the payment of entry fees. Financial assistance is not available to international fee-paying students.

Basic Fees for 2012 (incl GST):

- Domestic student entry for all NCEA standards and 3 scholarship subjects—\$76.70.
- International student entry to NCEA standards—\$383.30.

The school has no control over fees – we only collect them for NZQA. If you miss this date you will have to pay a late fee of \$50 on top of the standard fee—please do not delay.

If you have a Community Services Card bring it when making the payment to the school Business Centre—this automatically qualifies for a discounted rate.

Congratulations to the rugby teams for their success as we complete the round robin series at all levels. This is an excellent result by all teams.



Ready Steady Bake!

Maria McGregor (pictured below) placed second at the New Zealand Rising Young Baker 2012 competition recently. Mariah competed against two other finalists in a live 'ready steady bake' style showdown. The competition is run by Competenz, the Baking Industry Training Organisation and BIANZ, the Baking Industry Association of New Zealand, in a collaborative effort to promote baking as a career pathway for young New Zealanders.

Maria's McGregor's account of her success:

On 19 June I competed in the Rising Young Baker of the Year for 2012 at the Auckland Fine Foods Festival in Greenlane. We had 90 minutes to



make a loaf of Ciabatta bread, six olympic themed cupcakes and a fruit strudel. My competitors were a 14 year old fourth generation baker from Hastings and a 17 year old from Gisborne who worked parttime in a café. I wasn't worried, because for the two weeks prior to the competition I had been honing in on my inner baker with Malcolm Cook, a baker/teacher for Bakels. Malcolm and I worked together at Bakels

headquarters practising, testing and tasting all new cupcake recipes, strudel fillings and ciabatta recipes. It was a very early start on the big day, we were on the road by 8am. Robert Samupo was the other student who was taught alongside me in Malcolm's industry-sized kitchen and so for the last couple of weeks he was there as my support. We arrived at Bakels HQ, boxed up all of our pre-made pastry from Monday, our pre-weighed ingredients and other equipment needed that day including

pastry brushes, cutters, dough scrappers and even extra water. We arrived at the festival, registered, and then began to take in just how big of a deal it really was. There were hundreds of stalls set up and our competition was to be held in "Bakery World". The benches were extremely small and not at all what I was used to but, as I acquainted myself with the facilities, I began to map out how I would organise all of my equipment and ingredients. The NZ



Pastry Team was just finishing up a demonstration before our competition was set to start. My Hospitality and Catering class finally made it and as the class counted down the clock from 10 seconds I was confident that with Malcolm beside me, I couldn't really mess anything up. All the competitors shook hands and that was it, we were all extremely focused on the task ahead of us. After 90 minutes I had produced six London olympic themed cupcakes, two ciabatta breads and two apple, cranberry and pistachio fruit strudels. Needless to say, my mentor, my hospitality teacher and my class were proud of me...all that was left was prizegiving. After several photos, an interview with the sponsors, Competenz, and a couple of tense moments, I had placed overall second, losing by a mere 2 points. I had won a \$500 baking apprenticeship scholarship, an iPod nano, a chef's jacket, apron and a hat. Overall it was an amazing experience and completely unforgettable.
