

Dear Parents and Guardians

Welcome to our first newsletter for the year. While there will be two newsletters per term, I would encourage you to keep in contact through the school website which is continuing to be developed.

Fourteen new staff started this year. They have established themselves and are making a valuable addition to the school. The roll of the school is 1863 which is getting closer to the desired 1850 that the school believes to be the ideal number. This is small enough to work in the four Whanau groups and big enough to offer the wide range of courses for our students. I have been most impressed with the resilience of staff and students while we are undergoing the rebuild. To have twenty classrooms out of action has put pressure on all the school, with every possible space being used as a classroom.



The success of the students in NCEA gave us a very positive start to the year. The highlights of these results were at year 13 where there was a 30% improvement from previous years. Also 90% gained level 2 or better. This tells us that if we can have students remain at school, they will achieve. The challenge for us is to increase the numbers who do stay at school while maintaining these excellent results. This we can do if we continue to work together. The school must

provide appropriate courses. The teachers must actively engage their students in learning.

We do know from our research into the students who continue at school and achieve that in most cases the parents make a significant contributions in three functions:

- Making sure your child does some school work at home. It is never true that a student does not have some work to do. It does not need to have been set by the teacher. It could be reading an article from the Herald which you have delivered every day. If they read it and give you a summary, you are improving your child's ability to read and comprehend.
- Attend the academic conferences. I am convinced that the programme of attending these conferences and making a connection with the whanau teacher is a major reason for the significant and sustained improvement that has been made in the schools examination results.
- Making sure your child is eating properly. Too many of our students are hungry at school. It is not possible to concentrate in class or take part in activities while you are hungry. It is crucial that students have a good diet. The school is not going to provide sweets, carbonated drink and poor quality pies. As part of the rebuilding we are only operating one canteen at the moment which is not sufficient for 1900 students. This increases the need for parents to provide a healthy sandwich and some fruit for your child to take to school.

A significant development this year has been the mentoring programme. Year 13 students mentor Year 10 and Year 12 mentor Year 9 students.

I have been impressed with the number of students who have undertaken the training to be a mentor. This programme has made a major contribution to the settling in of new students. We do know our senior students have developed good values and are achieving well. With their influence on the new students, I believe we will increase the engagement of the younger students which will increase the number who remain for five years.

#### **Pacific Islands Scholarships**
